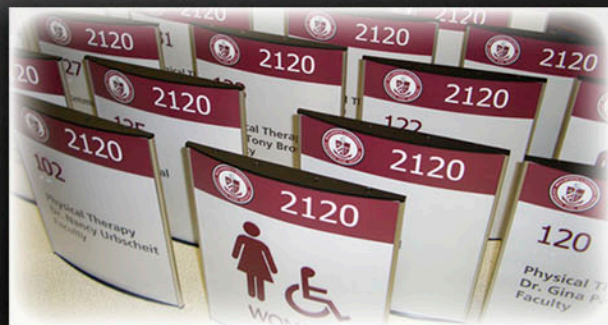
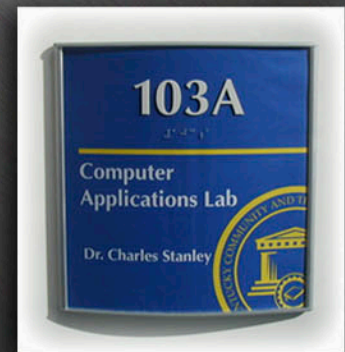


CONTOUR SIGN

CURVED METAL FRAME
CHANGEABLE ADA SIGNS

These curved front aluminum frames are very popular. This type of sign consists of three parts: an aluminum frame, a clear ADA compliant lens, and a paper insert. The paper insert can be changed by the consumer without having to order a new sign. Great for personnel offices, schools, or organizations that want the flexibility to update their signs.



CONTOUR ADA SIGN SPECIFICATIONS

FEATURE

Signs which designate permanent rooms and spaces:
room numbers, restrooms, exit signs

MATERIAL

1/16" thick acrylic sign panel with raised acrylic letters.
Painted surfaces are unacceptable. Sign panel sets in
curved anodized aluminum frame with black end caps.
Sign face can be clear to accommodate a changeable
paper insert.

TACTILE LETTER HEIGHT

5/8" min.- 2" max. All text raised 1/32" min.

LETTER TYPE

Upper Case Only

LETTER STYLE

Sans Serif (such as Helvetica, Optima, or similar)
Character Width: 55-110% of character height
Character Stroke: 10-15% of character height
Inter-Character Spacing: 1/8" min. - 3.8" max.

ADA PICTOGRAM

Raised Within 6" min. field. Verbal description directly below
The following symbols may be required:

- International Symbol of Accessibility
- International TTY Symbol
- Volume Control Symbol
- International Symbol of Access for Hearing Loss

BRAILLE

Domed Grade 2 Braille that meets ANSI and ADA requirements.
Domed California Braille to be used in the State of California.
Dot Height: .025-.037
Dot Diameter: .059-.063
Interdot Spacing: .090-.100
Horizontal Cell Separation: .241-.300
Vertical Cell Separation: .395-.400

FINISH

Characters and background: non-glare finish.

CONTRAST

Characters and Symbols must contrast with the background.
Light characters/symbols on dark background preferred.
